MAR: Ensuring Compliance amidst Uncertainty

The EU Market Abuse Regulation (MAR) came into force across Europe on 3 July 2016.

MAR establishes a common regulatory framework on insider dealing, market manipulation and the unlawful disclosure of inside information, and expands and develops the existing framework to cover a wider range of securities on a wider group of markets. It brings in sweeping changes to the market abuse regime as a whole, for both sell-side parties such as companies and their brokers, and buy-side parties such as asset managers and other persons and businesses dealing in securities. The attached article*, by Travers Smith partner Adrian West and professional support lawyer Jane Bondoux, looks at the effect of MAR on the compliance procedures of UK listed companies and AIM companies, including:

- policies and procedures for dealings by persons discharging managerial responsibility (PDMRs);
- disclosure of inside information and delays in disclosure; a
- insider lists.

On 24 June 2016, the Institute of Chartered Secretaries and Administrators, GC100 and the Quoted Companies Alliance jointly published a <u>guidance note</u> on MAR containing a specimen group-wide securities dealing policy, a securities dealing code and a dealing procedures manual.

As noted in our article, in the absence of widespread ESMA/FCA guidance, MAR still does leave a number of questions unanswered as to its application in practice. Travers Smith has been participating in a Joint Working Party of City lawyers working up a Q&A list which should be published in the next few days, and then supplemented as any further guidance emerges.

Companies should ensure that they have MAR-compliant policies and procedures on directors' dealings, disclosure of inside information and insider lists.
